

Treuddyn Circular Walks - No 1

Distance 2 ½ miles
Allow 1½ hours

This walk takes you past Carreg y Llech, an ancient standing stone that may have been part of a tomb or some sort of marker. You return to the village along a lovely old bridlepath lined with magnificent oak trees. In spring it is carpeted with wildflowers including violets and primroses while later in the summer you can watch blue tits and great tits busy collecting food for their young. The footpath from Fford y Rhos gives you a different view of St Mary's Church. The present building, which dates from 1874, replaced a much earlier one that was one of three ancient chapels of the parish of Mold.

Start in Village Community Centre car park on Queen Street

1 Walk up the path by the side of the Community Centre to the road.

2 Turn right onto the road and then left onto the footpath between the houses. Go over the stile on the right before the farm and through the field past Carreg y Llech to the road.

3 Cross over the road and go over the stile opposite. Follow the path along the hedge down to the left and go over the old stone stile. Turn right, walk along the hedge and go over the two stiles at the end of the track. Follow the path down to the left along the hedge all the way past the house on the left to the stile and footbridge by the road.

4 Turn right onto the road and right again into Fford y Sarn.

5 Turn right onto the bridlepath by the farm. This is a lovely old track that you follow all the way back up towards the village.

6 Turn right onto the road and then left onto the footpath just after you have entered the village. Continue around the back of the houses and go through the old metal kissing gate. Follow the well-worn path across the field to the kissing gate and continue to the road.
